Lenten Reflections



Each day during lent, all pupils have been taking part in a 5-minute meditation/reflection using a Lenten Prayer journal. The have watched reflective powerpoints, listened to quiet music or simply just sat in silence having 5 minutes to complete their journal or pray to God.

The children in Year 6 are leading towards a faith in action pin that is designed to allow young children to help them discover how faith shapes lives. They have chosen to support worship in school and raise money in the summer term for charity. They have helped design our prayer room to make sure it is an inviting space and are supporting all children in KS2 leading prayer on a Friday lunchtime.

They have focused on creative prayer and have created an interactive prayer wall for all children to use. Currently it has prayers on for family members and Lenten Promises. With the prayer room revamped and extra resources ordered they have been able to support pupils with worship. We now need to focus on resourcing prayer boxes to support staff with all liturgical times of the year.










Mini Vinnies

Year 4 Educational Visit





Year 4 children had the exciting opportunity to carry out some market research on a maths game called 'Race to Infinity'. They learned how to play the game on the iPads which required a lot of mathematical skill. They then answered questions about how they think the game could improve and what features they like/dislike about the game.

The children did such an amazing job with their market research that they were invited to Proto in Gateshead, where they specialise in Immersive technologies such as Virtual and Augmented Reality and Virtual Production.

The children visited the Immersive Lab where they saw first hand augmented and virtual reality demonstrations in the Digital Catapult NETV Immersive Lab. It was here where they had the opportunity to get hands-on experience of VR / AR.

At the Virtual Production Demonstration they looked at how Netflix / Disney+ and film companies create TV and film content by using games engine technology in a virtual production studio. The children then had a go at inventing their own Virtual Reality application.

The staff at PROTO were amazed at the children's knowledge and understanding of augmented Reality and Virtual Reality.

Our year three classes enjoyed taking inspiration from this exhibition and participating in a workshop using their designs to create a beautiful piece of art. After lunch in the Gallery, they walked to the Great North Museum where they were able to see the Ancient Egyptian artefacts in the Egyptian Gallery. They searched for and examined artefacts then took part in a code breaking exercise to read the hieroglyphic messages. They had a fantastic time and brought back some wonderful images.
