Eid - Al - Adha



Geography - Fieldwork

Year 6 made the most of their visit to Borrowdale by carrying out a geographical study of the River Derwent. As part of our local study of the Borrowdale area we have considered the causes of the flash flooding there in 2022. Year 6 investigated the depth of the river in Summer. Wielding metre sticks, measuring tape and kalipers, Year 6 eagerly plunged their feet into the rippling, cool waters just outside the Youth Hostel. The task was carried out with great efficiency and fantastic team skills. Quite a few children got a bit soggy along the way!







Y4 Ceramics

Year 4 created clay monsters in the ceramics in the studio at Sacred Heart High School, which is normally used for GCSE and A level work. They began by making a simple pinch pot, then added details using slip and cross hatching. Finally they could use the clay tools to add further decorations.
